STORY OF IMPACT

My name is Xamara, in 2013, my mother was largely absent, and my dad did everything he could to raise two daughters and a stepson without reliable support.

During this chaotic time, the YMCA became the one place where I felt safe and supported. Thanks to the YMCA scholarship program, my siblings and I experienced opportunities that would have otherwise been out of reach—summer camps, sports, and before- and after-school care. When my family was struggling most, the YMCA even provided Christmas gifts through the Angel Tree program, reminding us that we weren't alone.

The most influential experience was the annual campaign, which funded my participation in the Correia swim lesson program. At 13, I learned to swim safely for the first time, sparking a passion that helped shape my future.

Today, I'm proud to serve as a Head Lifeguard and Swim Lesson Instructor Trainer for the YMCA—the same organization that once supported me. The YMCA changed my life's trajectory, offering stability, compassion, and the belief that every child deserves the chance to thrive.
